SALVAGE is at the end of the Eastport Peninsula that juts out into Bonavista Bay, NL. It means, "horribly wild, rugged and treacherous".

Many outports in Newfoundland are known for their multi-coloured houses, but Salvage and area is dotted

with "saltboxes" painted white on white. Stages are kept in the ochre of the past.
